



- Participants also had an opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback on the preliminary Plan Area boundaries.








# Topic 1: Community Strengths and Identity Sample Themes/Takeaways

- Rural character and natural landscape has attracted many new residents and should be supported.
- Darkhorse, LOP, and other areas in the project area seem disjointed. It is hard to see what the community identity is.





## Topic 1: Community Strengths and Identity Sample Themes/Takeaways

- There is a need for more community public space to foster community identity and provide a good location for community events.
- Many residents feel they belong to the Auburn community rather than the South Nevada County community.
- Do we want to be more like a bedroom community for Auburn or Grass Valley, or maintain a more rural environment?



Topic 2: Housing and Development Vision Sample Takeaways

- Keep higher density development in the Higgins Corner to make a walkable "village center."
- Maintain agricultural and rural character of areas outside Higgins Corner.
- Housing is needed that is attractive to seniors (e.g., smaller houses, condos, assisted living, and near services).
- Reliable, high-quality internet service is needed.



# Topic 2: Housing and Development Vision Sample Themes/Takeaways

- Development should not exacerbate traffic or create wildfire safety issues.
- Infrastructure quality and capacity (e.g., water, power, and transportation) need to be ensured prior to development of an area.
- The design of Higgins
   Marketplace (Holiday Market)
   fits into the community and is
   a good example of suitable
   development scale and design.



# Topic 3: Recreation and Public Space Vision Sample Themes/Takeaways

- Prioritize multi-use trails and paths that can be used for recreation as well as getting to destinations.
- An outdoor gathering space like a town square is needed.
- Community spaces should be connected by walkable paths.





# Topic 3: Recreation and Public Space Vision Sample Themes/Takeaways

- A farmer's market would likely be well-supported by the community.
- School facilities and the Lions Club can be used for public recreation and gathering spaces today.






## Topic 4: Transportation Vision Sample Themes/Takeaways

- There is traffic congestion along Magnolia Road and Route 49, and traffic impacts of new development should be studied.
- There are general concerns over the safety of walking and bicycling in the area.



## Topic 4: Transportation Vision Sample Themes/Takeaways

- Trails/paths for walking, biking, and using golf carts are needed, especially from Lake of the Pines to Higgins Corner. A path could connect to the existing path along Magnolia Road (Higgins Trail – shown to the right).
- The existing sections of Higgins Trail could be enhanced, widened, and extended eastward to the Lions Club Community Center.
